he first Lamb and Potato Festival was held in January 1987 in Rotary Park on the New England Highway.

Event organisers hoped to catch the eye of passing traffic, particularly travellers on their way to and from the Tamworth Country Music Festival.

Over the years this has proved a very successful tactic and Guyra is now a "must stop" for people as they make their way to and from the Country Music Capital.

Rotary Park is an ideal location for such an event with plenty of shade provided by the established trees which stretch for more than a kilometre along the highway. The park also has a purpose built kitchen, an amenities block, children's playground and plenty of available parking.

The Lamb and Potato Festival has continued to promote Guyra for around 12 days each January taking in the Australia Day weekend, including the flag

This is a feature of the Festival that is always incredibly popular and involves a coordinated effort that brings together the whole community to assist with food preparation, night time caretaking and maintaining the site.

Guyra is proud of its local produce and the Festival aims to showcase this produce, which is used in the tasty meals that are available each day.

The meals are prepared by an army of volunteers from local groups who commit time each year to man the food gazebo.

To keep up with the orders requires a lot of people and Julie Gittoes heads up a team of 20 volunteers working two

shifts each day.

While some of the volunteers will work more than once, by the time the Festival ends she will have worked with close to 500 people to get the job done.

A large percentage of

money raised is channelled back into community organisations each year, with over \$35,000 disbursed to community groups in 2019.

Antique Machinery

Southern end of Festival site Saturday January 25th & Sunday January 26th

The Antique Machinery Rally is an extremely popular traditional feature of the Lamb and Potato Festival.

Located on the Southern

end of the Festival site the rally will run on Saturday January 25th and Sunday January 26th.

You will get to see many antique engines in opera-

tion, with exhibitors coming from across a wide area. Swap sites will be operating during this time for antique machinery enthusiasts. It provides a fascinating experience for the whole family and is located in close proximity to the many other features which can be enjoyed at the Lamb and Potato Festival.

Train rides daily

Train rides operate each day of the Festival, on a section of disused rail line that separates the Festival site from the main street.

Rides will run from 9.30am in the morning until 4.30pm each afternoon.

Sit back and relax as members of the local Historical Society take you on a short journey along the tracks with expert commentary.

You will pass through the centre of town for a unique view of the main street and the Mother of Ducks Lagoon.



Learn some of the history of the town and its buildings as you pass, before returning to the Festival site to enjoy more of what is on offer. A lot of behind the scenes work has been needed to make this ride goes ahead this year, so make sure you get on board.

Explore the area

Natural Beauty on our doorstep

he New England area is renowned for its natural beauty and Guyra provides visitors with an ideal base from which to explore the many National Parks and nature reserves.

Despite drought conditions that have persisted over the last two years you will still find plenty to see, and businesses and farmers will appreciate your support

Opportunities abound for those who enjoy trout fishing, bushwalking, bird-watching, self-drive tours and fossicking for sapphires.

If you are looking for something to do while visiting for the Festival, why not do a driving or cycling tour of the Guyra region.

January is the perfect time for a leisurely cycle or drive along the country roads running parallel to the historic rail line. Starting at Black Mountain travel north along the Black Mountain Road to Guyra, stop in and visit the Lamb and Potato Festival, then travel along the Llangothlin Road to Llangothlin and cross over to the Ben Lomond Road until you reach Ben Lomond.

Enjoy the historic railway stations at Black Mountain and Ben Lomond, soak up the summer sun, and experience the spectacular rural scenery along the way.

Further west you will find the historic tin mining town of Tingha and to the east the village of Ebor, both of which offer wonderful scenery and points of interest along the way.

Visitors can also make use of the town's sporting facilities including an 18 hole golf course, synthetic bowling greens, 25m undercover heated swimming pool and all weather tennis courts.
