### Turmoil in the ranks - moves to sack CEO

Deep divisions within Armidale Regional Council have once again been highlighted, with seven councillors last week calling for an extraordinary meeting asking for the termination of CEO Susan Law's contract of employment.

The motive behind the move is unclear with all seven of the councillors refusing to go public with their reasons. Cr Margaret O'Connor is one of those leading the push and said that because it is a private matter involving staff, under the Local Government Act councillors cannot comment publicly.

The same group of seven councillors passed a motion of no confidence in Mayor Simon Murray in January. Following that vote Cr Simon Murray refused to step down from the top job and along with Deputy Mayor Lib Martin they are now throwing their support behind the CEO.

"To be honest I do not know the reason behind this latest move and no one is talking," Cr Murray said.

"What I do know is that we can't let this sort of behaviour go unchecked."

"If they succeed it will mean that the CEO has no choice but to resign and that has huge implications for council and the community.

"Financially we would be looking at well in excess of \$600,000 to pay out the CEO's contract and then more to undertake recruitment for a replacement.

"With only six months to go before the term of this council ends this is stupidity – a new council may have a totally different point of view so why impose this cost on council when elections are due in September? All this with no indication from the seven councillors involved as to why."

"The CEO has been a strong leader and from my point of view has performed well in that position. She is doing

what we employed her to dostaff numbers at the top have been reduced as part of an organisational restructure that was agreed upon by all councillors, reducing a top heavy structure and keeping people on the ground.

"Now there is turmoil all the way up the ranks and for what? The community needs to say that we don't want this and put pressure on the seven councillors to take a step back and think about how much this will cost the community both financially and in terms of our reputation and the future of the region going forward.

Deputy Mayor Lib Martin said that she is also at a loss as to the reasons behind the move and confirmed that none of the rebel group are talking.

"They won't tell us what the problem is and I can see no real reason why they would choose to do this," Cr Martin said. "If the CEO has done something wrong tell us and tell the community.

"This uncertainty is not good for council, it is not good for the workers and it is not good for the community who need to know that their councillors are working for them and not for themselves."

The extraordinary meeting is expected to take place on March 12th and will be a closed session as it is a staff matter under discussion.

# **BOM Forecast** quides Council

Council is playing it safe and maintaining current water restrictions for the Armidale region at least until the latest forecast from the Bureau of Meteorology is released in March.

Recent above average rainfall has had a positive effect for farmers and an increased optimism has returned to the region. Storage levels have increased but not to levels sufficient to remove water restrictions.

The current combined water storage capacity for our region sits at 54 percent. Guyra Dam is currently at 100 percent capacity but only represents 4 percent of our total water storage. Malpas Dam is at 50.45 percent.

Armidale Regional Council Mayor Cr Simon Murray said it was important for the community to acknowledge one overall water storage level now that the Malpas/Guyra pipeline was in place and dams are connected.

"It is great news that Guyra Dam is at 100 percent but as quickly as it fills it can also empty just as quickly if we don't keep our water usage in check," said Cr Murray.

"2019 was a horrendous year and our water storage was pushed to the limit. We don't know what the rest of 2020 will bring with rainfall and we must be conservative in our outlook predictions."

Council is currently developing at 30-year Integrated Water Cycle Management (IWCM) Strategy and Secure Yield Model to assess the long-term needs of the Armidale region's water infrastructure, supply and community expectations. Included in this work will be an updated Drought Management Plan that will identify water restriction and easing triggers for future implementation. This document is expected to be completed by the end of the Financial Year.

"Our previous drought management plans from the former Guyra Shire and Armidale Dumaresq Councils did not reflect the drought conditions and climate change being experienced in our region," said Cr Murray.

"The work within the IWCM will contain the latest research, data and modelling to ensure our plans reflect our current circumstances and any potential climate change implications."

# Rail Trail back on the agenda

The New England Rail Trail was last week buoyed by support from Armidale Regional Council who resolved to support the declassification of the rail corridor allowing for the construction of a rail trail and allocated a maximum of \$25,000 to further develop existing business plans for the project. They also agreed to seek advice on funding streams from State and Federal governments for the trail's development.

However, they are now facing a rescission motion which has once again put any further developments on hold until after the next meeting of council.

The motion that went before last week's meeting heard from both supporters and opponents of the proposed rail trail, with supporters David Boundy and Sam Doyle describing the venture as a tourism opportunity that needs approval sooner rather than later and an absolute no brainer that the community would be proud of going forward.

The opposing argument came from Pam Youman who spoke of division in the community and Rob Lenehan who said that clo-

sure of the rail line should be avoided at all cost and that opposition has grown and gained support.

The motion was passed with Councillors Bailey, Galletly, Gray, Martin, Murray and Tiley voting to proceed. They agreed to a governance structure which would include Armidale Regional Council, Glen Innes Shire Council and the New England Rail Trail as a minority member.

This would allow for the commencement of designs and project planning, including scoping, advise councils on the transfer of the rail corridor and prepare land tenure and funding applications. so its formation is a big step forward for rail trail enthusiasts.

Councillors O'Brien, O'Connor and Widders voted against the motion and Cr O'Connor has since lodged a rescission motion which will see the debate back before council at their March meeting.

### ADRA expanding to better serve community

The ADRA Op Shop in Guyra is preparing to launch a bigger better service for the community. The recent completion of a large shed will see the service branch out offering more room and a larger range of goods.

ADRA Manager Helen Turnham said that the larger space will allow them to have separate areas for their stock and provide a more streamlined service.

"The original building will be where you will find clothes and accessories in one room and books and toys in the other," she said. "The exciting thing is that we now have a nice new shed with lots of space where you will be able to browse through a large selection of crockery, knick-knacks and larger items such as furniture."

Plans for a grand opening are now in progress for Wednesday March 11th and the shop will be open for extended hours on this day from 10am until 6pm. "As an opportunity shop everything is always on special, but to mark the opening there will be a couple of extra special tables," Helen said. "We have been building up stock levels for around 18 months so there is plenty of stock and there is lots of good quality items available."

As part of the community, ADRA likes to keep things local and money raised through the shop provides support such as vouchers for drought relief. They also appreciate the support from the community with most of their donations sourced locally.

"When we first started we imported stock from other op shops but now due to the generosity of the community we no longer need to do that," Helen said. "Donations are always welcome, but it is best to get in touch and we will arrange collection, particularly for larger items."

### \$20,000 for St Marys water project

Member for New England, Barnaby Joyce, last week announced a \$200,000 investment in 12 projects for schools throughout the electorate.

Included in the funding announcement is St Mary of the Angels Primary School who will receive \$20,000 for their 'Water For Our Future' project. They will drill a bore and install piping to access water for playground use.

This will enable to school to provide a green space for stu-

dents to actively participate in safety, in a town on Level 5 water restrictions, while also drought-proofing the school for future times of water restrictions

Funding is being provided under the Federal Coalition Government's \$30.2 million Local Schools Community Fund.

It was a busy couple of days with students not only competing in a range of junior judging activities, but also preparing and showing eight head of cattle.


Students did really well in all areas with Stephanie Cameron being awarded Reserve Champion parader out of approximately 80 students from schools across the region being the highlight.
