We live just over an hour from Mexico City so we stopped along the way at a little restaurant. I had the best taco ever (ever being until Saturday) and a sweet pink drink made from hibiscus nectar.

Redevelopment underway

Northern Tablelands MP Adam Marshall and Armidale Regional Council Mayor Sam Coupland have turned the first ceremonial sods of soil to formally commence construction work of the \$3.9 million Dumaresq Dam Recreation Area redevelopment.

Dumaresq Dam will be closed to the public for approximately six months while the construction works take place. Local contractor JNC Group Indigenous Contractors has secured the contract for the works.

The redevelopment includes a new contemporary amenities block, picnic shelters and barbecue facilities, bitumen internal roads, camping and parking areas as well as long bay parking near the upgraded boat ramp.

Armidale Regional Council Mayor Sam Coupland said this is a perfect start to 2023 and marked an important milestone for the Dumaresq Dam reserve and for the region.

"Council has worked hard to develop a strategy that will drive jobs and growth and put our region on the map as a destination that is on the move and open for business," Cr Coupland said.

"An important part of that strategy is providing world class amenities and attractions like the Dumaresq Dam Reserve that supports growth and provides an enticing proposition for families considering a move to regional NSW and to visitors to our region."





After lots of misunderstanding, and repeated chatting, we arrived home. We arrived at the community's entrance and there was water cascading down the walls like a waterfall.

When I was shown my room I believe I would have been less surprised if there had been a colony of penguins in my bed. I went upstairs to my bedroom and discovered it was bigger than 85% of Sydney apartments.

The one 'bedroom' contains a full ensuite bathroom, a floor to ceiling walk in closet, a two seat lounge, queen bed and a whole set of stairs leading to an indoor balcony bigger than my whole Australian bedroom. I unpacked my whole suitcase haphazardly stuffing it drawers and on shelves then crashed.

Life has just been a whirlwind since then. In the middle of the community is something they call 'The Casa Club.' It is like an all-inclusive community centre with a cinema, rooftop tennis courts and soccer fields, an indoor squash court, separate social rooms for kids, teenagers and adults, a hair-

dresser/barber, a spa, a small grocery shop, a cafe, multiple sized and shaped swimming pools, a yoga/dance studio and a gym.

My host parents Karin and Roberto took me to the Casa Clubs cafe for breakfast on Friday morning before setting up my phone then relaxing ahead of a busy weekend and week.

On Saturday lunchtime we headed to Karin's grandmother's 80th birthday party. I met her nieces and nephews, aunts and uncles, cousins and parents as well as many friends of the nieces and nephews.

We had a big lunch catered by Chef Gallo (a nephew), who is a chef and restaurant owner. This is where I had my second best taco ever in two days. The dish is called birria and consists of meat and cheese in a tortilla, garnished with coriander and diced onion, that you dip in or drink with a warm spicy liquid sauce.

Her nieces and nephews, along with their friends, played lots of popular Mexican music. They also had an impersonator and a mariachi band. The party lasted at least 12 hours with us leaving at midnight.

Sunday was church. I still don't

believe in God and didn't understand anything they said but the building itself was so gorgeous. After church we had brunch with two of their friends, who both work at Instituto Metepec and send their 1 and 3 year olds there.

I start school at 7AM and get picked up at 2:30 PM. School lasts 7 ½ hours with 50 minutes of breaks. It has been good so far except that only one girl speaks a bit of English but it is helping me practise and improve my Spanish.

On the first day they played me music, bought me some lollies to try and asked a lot of questions. We also helped move old artwork to a spare room in the primary school and played volleyball.

I've also attended my first two Spanish classes, the first was not good as they just spoke about their holidays completely in Spanish but the second was better, we played Spanish word bingo called Lotteria and practised using and adapting verbs.

I attended my 2nd birthday party on Friday night, this time it was a karaoke party so if you know me you will know just how excited I was about it. Saturday I stayed home because I didn't feel well so I just cleaned a little and cooked by myself for the 1st time since I got here.

On Sunday I attended the 'Ballet Folklorico de Mexico' at the Palacio de Bella Artes in downtown Mexico City. It was an immersive and wonderful experience all round, the architecture was amazing and the show was so vibrant and interesting.

It was by far the coolest thing I have ever seen (yet), besides the grown man wearing a leotard, dressed as the devil doing the macarena. I do not know how to feel about that part.

I am beginning to feel that what they say about coming back as a different person is true.

I am learning Spanish and how to cook Mexican food. I genuinely enjoy going to school and I have been journaling and going to the gym every night. Overall my first almost fortnight has been amazing, I have experienced and tried so many new things and look forward to my next 11 months in Mexico. Well wishes from Mexico,

Little Quoll

At the present time one of the many animals I'm caring for is a special little animal called a Spotted Tailed Quoll.

I've cared for many quolls over the past 25 years but this little guy is the first baby quoll I've ever had come into care. His mother was hit by a car and killed near Dundee which is north of Glen Innes.

He was found staggering around near her on the side of the road. He was most likely riding on her back as she went about her night looking for food before being hit.

During the impact that killed his mother, he was also injured. He copped a whack to the head which caused bleeding from his nose as well as concussion. He weighed just 165g (less than an apple) and appeared to be underweight – his head looked a bit big for his body.

From my measurements he was around 100g underweight. He was very thirsty and hungry and needed a good sleep, which he did a lot of for the first week. He was soon gaining weight and a week later he weighed 285g. He currently weighs 585g.

He has enjoyed eating mice, sparrows plus chicken hearts and has been having milk as well, which he will be weaned off at around 750g. He was housed inside for around 18 days and was then placed in an escape proof enclosure outside.

I placed his bed inside a timber box but he has since dragged bits of dry grass into a hollow log and made himself a cosy bed in there instead. So good to see his natural instincts kicking in.

From the quiet, dazed and lethargic little guy he was just over a month ago, he is now so much stronger, lively and very much a wild little quoll. He is



going ahead in leaps and bounds and will be released in the near future once he's a more predator proof size as I don't want him to be a snack for a fox or feral cat.

The election is coming get ready to vote

The NSW State election will be held on Saturday, March 25, and the NSW Electoral Commission is asking NSW voters to get ready to vote by enrolling to vote or checking their enrolment is up to date.

NSW Electoral Commissioner John Schmidt said that now was a great time to get election ready.

"Whether you need to enrol for the first time, update your details or just check where you are enrolled, it's quick and easy to do online."

"Visit the website *elections*. *nsw.gov.au* and you'll get all the information you need."

Mr Schmidt said more than 100,000 people in NSW would be eligible to vote, but are not on the electoral roll.

"It is compulsory to enrol to vote in NSW if you are eligible and 18 or over."

"With a state election coming up, we want as many people as possible enrolled correctly and ready to have their say." "All you need to enrol is a driver's licence, an Australian passport number, or have someone who is enrolled confirm your identity."

Mr Schmidt said he also encouraged anyone who had moved recently to check, and update if needed, their enrolment.

"Moving is a busy time, but it's really important that once you move you put updating the electoral roll on your to-do list."

"Service NSW has put together a check list for NSW residents of who may need to be notified when you move house, including details of how to change your enrolment."

"It will make voting in your new area much easier and election day March 25th isn't far away," he said.


