

## Save and Grow Guyra awaiting response from Minister for Local Government

Save and Grow Guyra (SGG) are eagerly awaiting a response from the NSW Minister for Local Government Ron Hoenig, endorsing the separation of Guyra and Armidale council.

The group sees this is a crucial step towards granting local communities control and financial independence.


In June this year, SGG made a submission, supported by a petition, calling for the separation of Guyra from Armidale to form a new local government area.

They were disappointed with the Minister's initial response and are now calling on him to reconsider.

In a letter to the Minister they expressed 'deep dissatisfaction' with his response to their submission and said that his 'dismissive attitude and lack of consideration for the concerns and aspirations of the Guyra community' is deeply troubling.

They also believe the Minister's assertion 'that the de-amalgamation process would be too costly and burdensome' is premature and uninformed.

Save and Grow Guyra believes that the decentralisation of power is vital in fostering effective governance and ensuring decisions are made at the grassroots level. Separating Guyra

and Armidale councils will allow for focused attention on the unique needs and aspirations of each community.

Amanda Cohn MLC, Greens spokesperson for Local Government, recently tabled a bill in parliament endorsing the separation of NSW councils, emphasising the importance of restoring local control and financial

independence.

SGG Chairman Rob Lenehan said that her unwavering support, along with the backing of previous Labor ministers, has been a source of encouragement for Save and Grow Guyra.

"Our democracy due to the forced merger of NSW councils have suffered greatly," Mr Lenehan said.

"We eagerly await Minister Hoenig's response, hoping he will champion the cause of local autonomy and grant Guyra the independence it deserves.

"Save and Grow Guyra is urging the government to consider the long-standing desire of the community to have more self-governance and asks the Labor Minister to support the resolution proposed by Amanda Cohn.

"By taking this step, the government will demonstrate a commitment to strengthening democracy and empowering local communities."

Mr Lenehan said that the group actively engages with community members, government officials, and stakeholders to ensure that Guyra's unique identity and needs are properly represented and addressed.



### Popular Community Building Partnerships Program Slashed

Local schools, community groups, sports clubs and charities will have fewer funding opportunities with confirmation that the State Government has cut back the popular Community Building Partnerships Program.

I have condemned the government for cutting more than \$9 million from the program.

It's just mean and what's worse – it's a program Labor established the last time they were in government, so they can't blame the former Coalition Government for this one.

So many community groups benefit from this program, which previously saw each of the State's 93 electorates receive \$400,000 for local projects.

So many local community groups will either do it tougher or miss out entirely as a result of yet another mean government cut.

This latest decision is a complete kick in the guts for local communities.

### Regional Seniors Travel Card Petition Tabled in State Parliament



The petition will now trigger a debate on the floor of the Legislative Assembly when Parliament resumes.

The recent decision is heartless and will negatively impact more than 12,000 seniors in the Northern Tablelands and more than \$1 million across country NSW.

We cannot afford to sit idle and allow this card to be taken so coldly off some of our community's most vulnerable people, especially during a cost-of-living crisis.







### Rural Market Reports

### **Weekly Wool Market**

**November 3rd** - The national offering fell well short of the expected 47,000 bales but this wasn't enough of a reason for the market to diverge from its current sideways pattern.

The Northern region indicator lost 7 cents on the opening day of sales and repeated the same loss on the final day. It was the less stylish lower strength types that dragged the market down with the better style types selling at levels similar to that of last week.

42,750 bales were sold nationally for the week with the passed in rate climbing to 8.8%. Major buyers included Techwool, PJ Morris and Tianyu with the top two purchasing over a third of the Merino fleece offering.

The past 11 selling weeks has seen the Northern region market indicator close between 1185 and 1162 cents in what has been an unusual period of calm. AWTA test data released on Wednesday is now showing an increase of 3% in the weight of wool tested nationally for the season to date.

October recorded a large 14% increase and more than offset the July to September decreases. Sales will be held on Wednesday/Thursday next week due to the public holiday in Melbourne on Tuesday.
