# Costa awards funding to community groups

Seven organisations including community and sporting groups and a school will receive funding through the Costa Tomato Exchange Well Grown Community Grants Program for 2024.

State Manager NSW Brett Ryan said there were 40 applications for funding through the program, which this year provided grants across the five categories of: sporting event/activity; community event; community project; school project/initiative; and environmental initiative/activity.

"We were really pleased to see so many applications and it again made the selection process very difficult. We used an independent reviewer to assess the applications to ensure they were each judged fairly according to our criteria," Mr Ryan said.

"Given the large number of ap-

plications from sporting organisations we have decided to split the funding between three organisations, rather than just one."

## Planning & contingencies key to stock water systems

Landholders at Ben Lomond tackled on-farm waterway health and improving stock water systems, at a GLENRAC workshop on February 13th.

At the GLENRAC workshop in the Cromarty woolshed, The Pump Shed's Matt Ridley started the discussions with tips on how to plan for installing or upgrading a stock water system.

"As a rule of thumb, it's not too much from my experience to gear to the numbers you will be running, rather than 'oh, this will be enough'," Mr Ridley said.

"In the last drought, in winter stock were using the same amount of water as summer consumption, because of the supplementary feed, including salt."

As well as planning to deliver litres per animal per day, Mr Ridley said graziers should also plan for problems.

"In any system, it's best to have a contingency, especially as there may be a delay in parts delivery for repairs," he said. "You can't afford to have no water at all."

This was backed up by Dave Worsley, a grazier from Nullamanna, one of the landholders taking part in a project with GLENRAC and the Armidale Node of the SQNNSW Innovation Hub, to investigate best practice stock water systems for the local area.

"The biggest problem with my (original) system was no back up, so that when the pump went bang, everything went bang," Mr Worsley said.

His system now has redundancies, a monitoring system and plans for further infrastructure improvements

Manager of Winston Park and workshop host Anthony Rosser said as part of the stock water project, he was assessing two possible configurations for an upgraded water system on the Ben Lomond property.

"There's a huge productivity gain to be had there, by installing troughs and keeping cattle out of the dams, and improved water quality and security," he said.

"The other benefit is the protection of our local creeks and streams, allowing our creekbanks to revegetate and stabilise, because there's some quite steep areas where stock do access the water and obviously, it's inevitable there's some sort of erosion occurring and therefore sediment going into the stream."

Other speakers on the day included University of New England aquatic ecology expert Dr Sarah Mika, SQNNSW Drought Hub Armidale Node Manager Lu Hogan, NSW Local Land Services Drought Adoption Officer Matt Champness, and UNE's Jaimi-lee Edwards, who provided an update on a Future Drought Fund project.

GLENRAC CEO Kylie Falconer said all of the speakers on the day faced extensive questioning.


"I think the questions were the proof in the pudding for me. People came with specific questions in mind and asked them all."

Ms Falconer said more than 30 farmers were in the room for the workshop, travelling from Inverell to Walcha, and Guyra to Glen

Innes.

#### **Armidale Cattle Sale**

February 29th - Total Yarding: 1230 (-370)). A further reduction in numbers. Vealers and light weight yearlings were well supplied along with some very good cows.

Overall the quality of the offering was good albeit mixed for breed. Condition was fair to good with all buyers able to operate. There was strong breed specific demand from local restockers which resulted in steers under 330kg selling to dearer trends and posting strong gains.

There was also some breed related improvement in the heifer weaners. Medium and heavy weight yearling steers to restock and feed sold on a dearer market than a fortnight ago whilst showing some quality related price change in places.

Medium and heavy weight yearling heifers sold to a slightly dearer trend. Well finished heavy grown steers to process sold to a slightly cheaper trend with some weight and quality related price change.

The best of the heavy weight grown heifers sold to a slightly dearer trend. There was strong demand for cows with restockers active on those lighter in condition. Well finished heavy weights attracted strong processor competition with trends as much as 15c/kg dearer than a fortnight ago. Heavy bulls sold on a firm to slightly cheaper trend.

#### Weekly Wool Market

March 1st - Tuesdays opening of the market began promisingly. By the close of the day

individual micron indicators between 17 to 19.5 were 5 to16 cents dearer with a low passed in rate.

The momentum didn't flow onto the second day of sales delivering a mixed result but once again there was an extremely low passed in rate, indicating a well-supported, solid market.

The Northern region indicator finished the week unchanged with the Eastern market indicator climbing the barest of margins. Both indicators remain bang on their average weekly closing levels for the first 8 months of the 23/24 season.

35,669 bales were sold nationally for the week with a passed in rate of 6.5%. Major buyers included Techwool, PJ Morris and Endeavour Wool.

Total bales offered for the season to date has fallen broadly into line with last season after being 66,000 bales in front before the Christmas recess.

This is also in line with the AWTA test data released today which is showing just a 0.5% increase in the weight of wool tested nationally for the first 8 months of the season. The national offering over the next fortnight looks set to remain around the 40,000 bale mark.
