Aged care transition underway

Inverell-based not-for-profit aged care provider McLean Care has announced plans to transition its operations to a new provider, a move aimed at securing the long-term future of services in regional communities. Among the facilities impacted by the decision is the Kolora Aged Care Facility in Guyra, which has been operated by McLean Care since 2018 under a lease arrangement with Armidale Regional Council.

The decision comes in response to growing pressures facing aged care providers, particularly in regional areas. These include complex compliance requirements, rising operating and staffing costs, labour shortages, and the increasing expense of maintaining and upgrading facilities.

McLean Care Board Chair Manuel Meszaros said the transition was necessary to ensure services remain viable into the future.

"Unfortunately, the pressures on aged care providers, especially in regional areas, mean McLean Care's operations are no longer viable under our current operating model," he said.

The organisation employs more than 700 full-time, part-time and casual staff and operates 370 residential aged care beds across six facilities in Inverell, Guyra and Gunnedah, as well as Oakey and Milmerran. It also provides 82 independent living units co-located with residential facilities, at-home care services across Queensland, NSW and Victoria, and iAge Health, a virtual hub connecting regional and remote residents with healthcare professionals.

Mr Meszaros said residential facilities and home-care services will continue operating as normal during the transition process, with the

organisation working towards a seamless handover. He said potential new providers would be sought who align with McLean Care's mission-led ethos, commitment to high-quality care and resident well-being, and who have the financial capacity to operate sustainably into the future. Residents, families, home-care clients and employees are being kept informed as the process unfolds.

In a separate announcement, McLean Care confirmed CEO Sue Thomson stepped down from the

role on 12 February for personal reasons. Experienced aged care leader Jill Davidson has been appointed Interim CEO to guide the organisation through the transition. Mr Meszaros acknowledged Ms Thomson's contribution over more than 17 years with the organisation, including 12 years as CEO.

The transition process will be led by expert financial and legal advisers with support from the Commonwealth Government as the organisation seeks a new operator to continue services.



Rod Halsted brings his raw honesty and Aussie humour to Guyra Library

Author Rod Halsted will bring his raw honesty and Aussie humour to Guyra LT Starr Memorial Library when he appears in conversation on Friday, March 6th at 5.30pm.

The event offers readers the chance to meet the larrikin storyteller behind Take My Advice, I'm Not Using It! and hear firsthand accounts of a life that has swung from penthouse luxury to prison time and, ultimately, back to stability.

The community is invited to attend as Halsted recounts wild adventures and hard-earned lessons drawn from a life marked by addiction, crime and redemption, all delivered with the irreverent humour that has become his trademark. Having lived more lives than most, he tells his story with unflinching honesty and charm.

Rod drank with Bob Hawke, was rescued from jail by Charles Waterstreet, and spent time with one of the Great Train Robbers. But eventually it all caught up with him. He has since abandoned drugs and overcome alcohol addiction.

In his memoir, he takes audiences on a rollercoaster through hardship and recovery -

New speeds in force around Black Mountain

An 80 km/h speed limit is now in force on a section of the New England Highway around Black Mountain, with the change implemented last week in response to safety concerns in the area.

A spokesperson for Transport for NSW said the reduction was introduced to improve safety for all road users.

The speed limit has been lowered from 100 km/h to 80 km/h from 150 metres south of Thunderbolts Road to 1.25 kilometres north of Springmount Road at Black Mountain. The change is permanent and has been carried out in accordance with the NSW Speed Zoning Standards 2025.

"The speed zone was reduced due to numerous crashes on the New England Highway near the Black Mountain Road intersection," the spokesperson said.

"This section of the highway has a critical crash rate greater than the average for a high-speed undivided road."

Guyra Sheep and Lamb Sale

February 10th - At the Guyra Sheep and Lamb Sale on February 10th, agents yarded just under 7,500 sheep and lambs, with strong competition across most categories.

A new lamb operator entered the market and "put the cat among the pigeons", helping drive prices higher. The best lambs were up to \$20 dearer, topping at \$363.

Heavy lambs sold from \$280 to \$320, while an outstanding run of store lambs attracted very strong demand at around \$5.50/kg. Light store lambs reached \$175.

Heavy crossbred ewes sold to \$270, Merino ewes reached \$245, and Merino wethers topped at \$275. Light sheep were up to \$30 dearer, selling to \$160.

APL Guyra/Armidale

Armidale Cattle Sale

February 12th - Armidale penned 1187 head with an increase in quality through the young cattle. The regular buyers attended and operated to a dearer market for most categories.

Light weaners under 200kgs much dearer for steers 400c to 535c/kg and cheaper for heifers 320c to 430c/kg both to background competition. Light yearling background steers gained slightly 446c to 486c/kg.

Medium backgrounders much dearer 458c to 528c/kg the feeders gaining 28c/kg 420c to 520c/kg. Feeders to 480kgs lifted 11c/kg 350c to 492c/kg and heavy processors slightly dearer 430c to 444c/kg.

Light heifers to background cheaper 336c to 368c/kg. Medium feeders significantly dearer 370c to 436c/kg and similar backgrounders also dearer 388c to 422c/kg. Heavy feeder

Grown steers to process cheaper averaging 429c/kg similar heifers 400c to 428c/kg. Cows mostly dearer three and four score cows selling 332c to 390c/kg. Heavy bulls cheaper 340c to 388c/kg. Yearling bulls to feed 270c to 386c/kg.

Weekly Wool Market

February 13th - The Eastern market indicator closed this week at its highest level since July 2019. The Northern region indicator climbed 18 cents on the first day of sales and added a further 2 cents on the final day.

The 16.5 micron indicator was the only category that failed to gain ground, but it is also highly impacted by the quality of the offering on a weekly basis. The Eastern market indicator is now 40% higher than the opening

week of the 2025/26 season.

Even more impressive is the 51% jump in the EMI when looked at in US dollars. The current EMI at 1205 cents in US dollars represents the top 10% of prices received over the past 30 years. 35,417 bales were sold nationally for the week with a passed in rate of 5.1%.

Major buyers included Techwool, PJ Morris and Endeavour Wool with widespread support from the rest of the trade. A one week recess in wool sales will take place next week to allow for Chinese New Year.

This is the first time the industry has agreed to this as adding an extra recess week can cause a build-up of volume on offer upon resumption of sales. With the national woolclip expected to be down 12.6% this season fears of a large build up due to an extra recess week should be somewhat allayed. This report will recommence on the 27th


